

## Good Scriptures to Declare

**Thirty-day prayer program:** Scriptures to read over a loved one or person in need. Read these aloud and call out her/his name to the Father. This is more effective when prayed by those in authority over the person in need—parents, grandparents, spouse, pastors, or mature laymen who love and care for the person. Pray aloud, from a distance, and covertly. Put the person’s name in the blank and ask the angels to carry out these declarations over your loved one.

### Example prayer:

**Father God**, today we lift up our dear friend and loved one to you for a renewing of the mind and heart. **Father**, thank you for your Holy Spirit, please send your warrior angels and good laborers to our daughter/son. Conform us all to the image of your Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

**I declare Ephesians 1:16-19:** I “do not cease to give thanks for you, \_\_\_\_\_, making mention of you in my prayers: that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of **wisdom** and **revelation** in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your **understanding being enlightened**; that you may know what is the **hope of His calling**, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Ephesians 3: 14-19:** “For this reason I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, from whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, that He would grant you, \_\_\_\_\_ according to the riches of His glory, to be **strengthened with might through His Spirit** in the inner man, that **Christ may dwell in your hearts** through faith; that you, \_\_\_\_\_ being **rooted and grounded in love**, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height—to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you **may be filled with all the fullness of God**” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Colossians 1:9-14:** “For this reason we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, \_\_\_\_\_ and to ask that you may be filled with the **knowledge of His will** in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you, \_\_\_\_\_, **may walk worthy of the Lord**, fully pleasing Him, **being fruitful in every good work** and **increasing in the knowledge of God**; **strengthened** with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy; giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Colossians 3:12-17:** God has chosen you, \_\_\_\_\_. “Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on **tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; bearing with one another, and forgiving one another**, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. But above all these things **put on love**, which is the bond of perfection. And let the **peace** of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be **thankful**. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs,

singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Philippians 1:3-6:** “I thank my God upon every remembrance of you, \_\_\_\_\_, always in every prayer of mine making request for you all with joy, for your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this very thing, that **He who has begun a good work in you, \_\_\_\_\_, will complete it** until the day of Jesus Christ;” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Philippians 3:10-14:** Father, may \_\_\_\_\_ know Jesus, “**...and the power of His resurrection,** and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death...**forgetting those things which are behind** and reaching forward to those things which are ahead.” May \_\_\_\_\_, press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Philippians 4:6-7:** “**Be anxious for nothing,** \_\_\_\_\_, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare 1 Thessalonians 3:11-13:** “Now may our God and Father Himself, and our Lord Jesus Christ, direct our way to you, \_\_\_\_\_ And may the Lord make you **increase** and **abound in love** to one another and to all, just as we do to you, so that He may establish your hearts **blameless in holiness** before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all His saints” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare 1 Thessalonians 4:1-12:** “Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you, \_\_\_\_\_, should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God; for you know what commandments we gave you through the Lord Jesus. For this is the will of God, your **sanctification**...For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in **holiness**. Therefore he who rejects this does not reject man, but God, who has also given us His Holy Spirit. But concerning brotherly love you have no need that I should write to you, for you yourselves are **taught by God to love one another**; and indeed you do so toward all the brethren...But we urge you, brethren, that you increase more and more; that you also aspire to lead a quiet life, to mind your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you, that you may walk properly toward those who are outside, and that you **may lack nothing**” (NKJV; emphasis added).

**I declare Philippians 4:8-9:** “Finally, brethren, \_\_\_\_\_, whatever things are **true**, whatever things are **noble**, whatever things are **just**, whatever things are **pure**, whatever things are **lovely**, whatever things are of **good report**, if there is any **virtue** and if there is anything **praiseworthy**—meditate on these things. The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you” (NKJV; emphasis added). AMEN.
